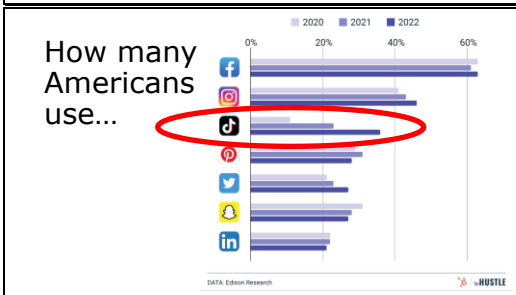
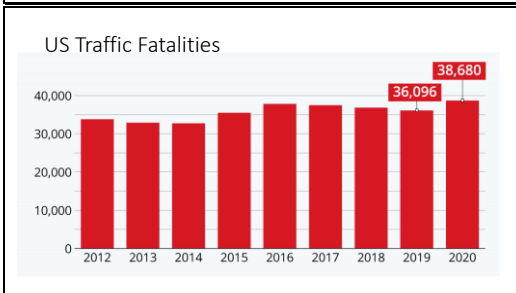


Shocked

Started by Croatian immigrant Joseph Vlasic, the Vlasic brand was handed down to his son, Robert, in 1963. By 1974, per capita US pickle consumption hit eight pounds, up 4x from the 1930s. Under Robert's leadership, Vlasic expanded to 96 kinds of pickles, peppers, relishes, and sauerkrauts. It eventually was taken over by Conagra Brands after going bankrupt as a spinoff from Campbell Soup.



% of US population ages 12+ on major social media platforms

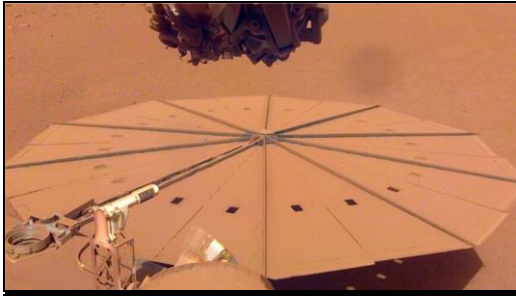


Deaths on U.S. roads soared to 16-year high in 2021
 Road fatalities increased more than 10 percent last year compared with a year earlier, reaching 42,915, according to estimates released by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

It was the highest number of deaths on the nation's roads since 2005 and the largest annual percentage increase since at least 1975.

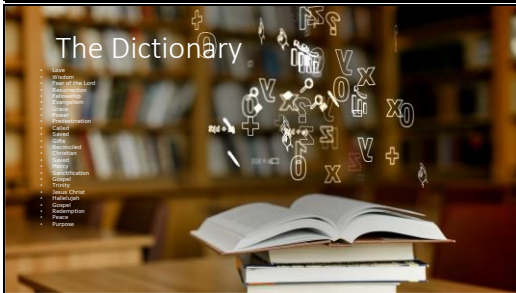
A recent image from NASA's InSight Mars lander shows the accumulation of dust on one of its two solar arrays, causing power levels to drop to critical levels.

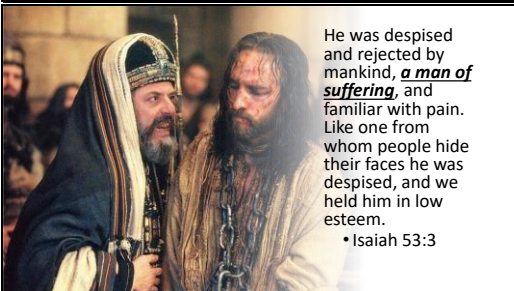

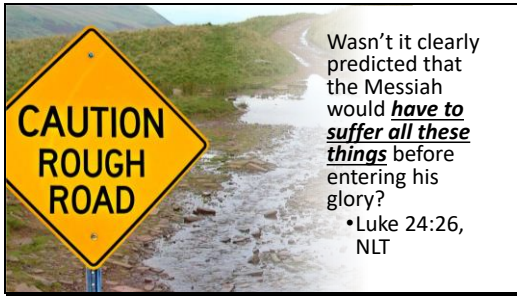


So, how do we live, move forward knowing that there is suffering both up ahead and behind?
I think the first thing we have to bite into is that Jesus experienced suffering. It was even predicted about him.



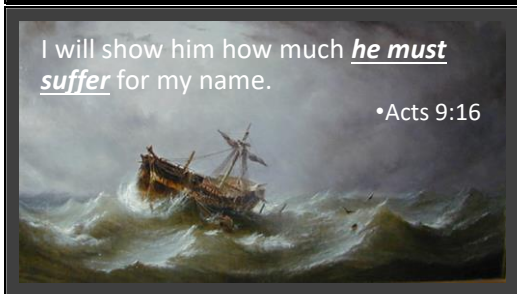

Paul experienced and saw this too.



I will show him how much **he must suffer** for my name.

Paul was blinded after seeing the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus. He's been blind for three days when God called Ananias to put his hands on Paul to heal him. Now Ananias didn't have any special talents, abilities, or medical degrees. But he did have the call and power of God's spirit. It was in the middle of this very difficult and confusing time that Ananias tries to give God an update on what's going on. Just in case God's internet connection was slow or cut off all together. Maybe God was behind in his reading and hadn't heard what was going on. Perhaps Paul's plot had gone unnoticed by God. After all, God is God. He's got lots on his plate. But God's answer opens the door into a place we don't want to look into. I will show him how much he must suffer for my name. Acts 9:16 Paul's sight was about to be restored. And that's a good thing. But Paul's also going to see how much he's going to suffer.

Just before David rejoices in his head being anointed. Just before he gratefully sings about his cup overflowing. His situation was very tough. He was in a dark place, with evil all around. And God was using his rod and staff, the tools of his correction and discipline.

It was in the middle of tough times that God showed up for David. And it's in the middle of tough times that God shows up for us. We don't get grace in advance of when we need it. It always, always, always comes just when we need it.

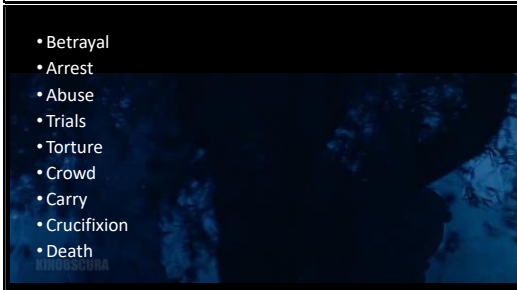

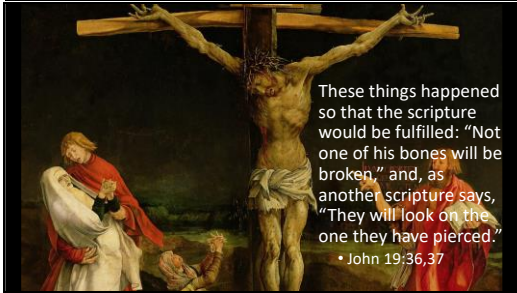

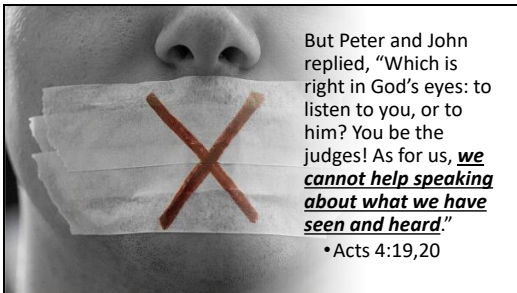
